### **Message from CEO**



Dear VRM Seafarers and Families

Year 2024 has been very kind to us, our Seafarers, and their families. We saw our Owners growing and securing more ships. Sonika and I travelled a lot to Ship Owners and Ships. VRM office staff visited many ships. Joining of Mr Praveen C Shukla as Managing Director of VR Marine Services Pte Ltd Singapore has helped us to sustain and increase the crewing business. He is also reviewing many processes to improve our operational efficiency.

Presently we have 162 Office staff, 9 offices in India and we are doing 177 Ship's crew management, whereby some ships have complete crew and some have only handful VRM Seafarers onboard. Our pool strength is 3058 Seafarers from India and 315 from other nations. We are proud of see retention rate of 91% this year and 89% of our Seafarers completed contract. We promoted 512 Seafarers this year, nice to see 18 Ratings becoming Officers after acquiring CoC. we honoured 418 Seafarers in our office, and we gave employment to many young fresher Seafarers whose father / first relatives are working in our company for more than 5 Years.

We had challenges also, especially for ships transiting red sea. We are happy to see no incident on our ships during transit. Good Safety practices onboard helped us secure 100% good health sign off record. ZERO legal cases against VRM and Zero Seafarer's Grievances shows bonding between our Ship Owners, VRM Office and our Seafarers.

Our Training Dept has now added Mental Wellbeing course for Seafarers in addition to Owner's specific requirements such as ECDIS, Hazmat, BRM, ERM, Practical Marine Electrical Workshop, Safety Onboard etc. I am happy to announce that we shall have bigger Training facilities in year 2025 with more Owner's and vessel specific short courses for our Seafarers.

Three departments were added this year in our office:

- a) Birthday Cake dept (Mumbai HO)
- b) Trainee Officers (Cadets, TME) Placement dept at Chandigarh office
- c) Dept for Pre-Employment Medical Exam & Onboard all medical cases at Chandigarh Office

The results are very encouraging.

- a) I am happy that we celebrated 1025 Seafarers Birthdays this year (started from May 2024) by sending special Cakes and our wishes to families of our Seafarers.
- b) All our Cadets and TMEs who passed exams were placed within 20 days of acquiring CoC as 3rd Officers and 4th Engineers. Next year we expect 90% of our 3rd Officers and 4th Engineers from VRM pool itself. We have to rely less on market. TS Rahaman remains or approved Maritime Training Institute for all Pre Sea-Training courses.
- c) Stringent medicals and knowing past medical history of Seafarers has resulted in reducing medical sign off cases to 1% this year. We do quarterly meetings with 14 approved Doctors across India to share our experiences with medical issues ashore / onboard. Problem areas during PEME as Kidney stone, Bad dental condition, High BMI, High Sugar, BP issues etc. We have company nominated Doctor, Dr JK Manghani to attend to all medical's issues for our Seafarers (Onboard, on-leave).

I must bring to your notice areas of concern also:

- 1) Recently we seen disturbing rise in dismissal cases of Seafarers due to alcohol abuse onboard. Self has been onboard for investigation. We have taken action against such Seafarers which includes reporting the matter to Flag state, Unions & seeking CDC ban for 5 Yrs with DG Shipping. We have added investigation report sharing with Seafarers during briefing at Office.
- 2) Another focus area is Hygiene onboard esp. galley and accommodation. We have installed USD 20 per month award to best cabin. Some of our Owners have asked us to stay focussed on the aspect of clean Cabin, clean boiler suits, good clothes wearing habit by our Seafarers and good presentation of ship including PSC Inspections.

We are 15 Years young now and recently our TME Sikandar Kureshi (Nanded) has become Chief Engineer onboard as well as our Cadet Rahat is Chief Officer. Our Training program is successful as we have more 3rd officers and 4th Engineers coming from our selected Cadet pool itself. We have 5 Lady Officers also serving on our ships. I am happy to inform that Capt. Shakil Sayyed saved life of 200 people at Sea and he was awarded for his act of humanity in India. VRM was also given award for highest number of various types of ships under crew management.

I was contacted by 63% of our Seafarers / families during this year. I am available on my mobile no +91-9930467030 to all our Seafarers and families at all times. I am presently member of DG Shipping advisory board and also on the panel of experts committee to formalise Standard Seafarers Employment Agreement for Indian Seafarers. We also thank DG Shipping for ease of documentation for our Seafarers especially sea-time assessment, issuance of CoC, BSID, CDC etc. MUI & NUSI supported us for compliance with CBAs and extending help to distressed India Seafarers across globe.

Formalise Standard Seafarers Employment Agreement for Indian Seafarers. We also thank DG Shipping for ease of documentation for our Seafarers especially sea-time assessment, issuance of CoC, BSID, CDC etc. MUI & NUSI supported us for compliance with CBAs and extending help to distressed India Seafarers across globe.

I look forward to safe working onboard by each one of you and we remain indebted to our Owner's for giving us continued work. I am sure we will be your 1st choice for employment always and our Owner's will continue to have faith in our professionalism. We look forward to Great 2025 and our New Year Wishes to you and your families.

#### Filter-Regulator-Lubricator (FRL) on compressed air line

#### Purpose of an FRL in a compressed air line:


A Filter Regulator Lubricator (FRL) fitted in a compressed air system serves to deliver clean dry air, at the required pressure, and lubricates the equipment which it runs. This in turn increases the operational lifetime of the equipment.

Typically, an FRL (Fig. 1) is fitted after the shut off valve, the filter is the first component in the air line; then the regulator; and finally, the lubricator. Some may not be provided with a regulator; in which case only the filter and lubricator are fitted in the system.




Fig. 2 FILTER

**Filters** (Fig. 2) protect pneumatic devices from damage that would be caused by contaminants from the compressed air such as lubricant particulates ejected by the compressor, dirt particles, small water droplets or aerosols.

**Lubricators** (Fig. 3) provide a continuous stream of atomized oil for lubrication of the internal working parts of pneumatic tools, and to other devices such as actuating cylinders, valves, and motors. Lubrication helps reduce friction between sliding surfaces to not only improve efficiency and increase cycling speed of a component, but reduces wear, which ultimately means longer component life & less maintenance.

**Regulators** control the pressure in the air supply that is delivered by the air compressor.

#### To ensure effective working of an FRL:

- The lubricator bowl should always be filled with oil to sufficient level. Oil can be added with either the air supply on or off.
- In working the air motor, turn the oil controlling screw and adjust oil rate to about 1 to 2 drops about every minute.
- If drain deposits in the filter, it should be discharged by loosening the drain valve at the bottom.
- Regular cleaning of the filter element may be necessary as it could affect the air permeability due to clogging from dust/debris from the compressed air line. The filter element should be cleaned with light oil, dried and refitted.
